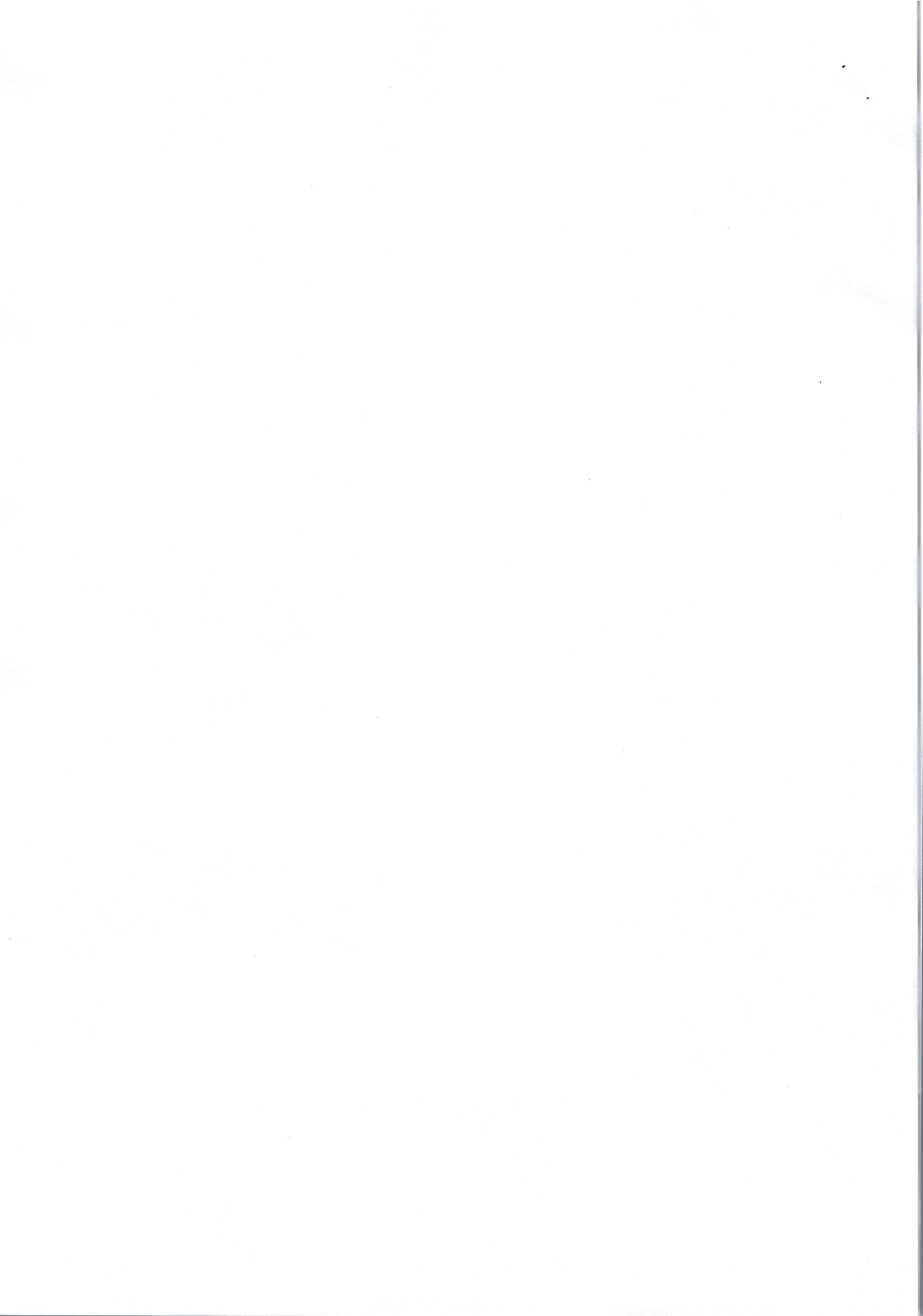

**MINUTES OF THE MEETING OF THE COMMITTEE APPOINTED BY THE HON'BLE HIGH COURT
TO DETERMINE SUITABILITY OF NURSING COLLEGES IN M.P.
HELD VITUALLY ON 12, 13th AND 14th JANUARY 2025**

The meetings of the Committee were held virtually wherein the Chairman and Members joined online and Nodal Officer Dr. CP Shukla presented cases of the Colleges.

The Hon'ble High Court in its order dated 7th January in WP No. 20 of 2025 and dated 8th January in WP No. 744 of 2025 directed petitioner nursing Colleges who were found deficient to appear before this Committee and satisfy it with regarding to removal of deficiencies observed by the CBI team in second round of inspections carried out in compliance to the orders of the Hon'ble Court.

Perusal of the orders shows that the Petitioner nursing colleges have obtained order of the Hon'ble Court by misrepresentation and making factually incorrect submissions. They led to the Hon'ble Court to believe that the extant Committee has been constituted for examining the representations of the Colleges found deficient by the CBI team in the second round of inspections. These petitioners pleaded before the Hon'ble Court that in WP No. 1080/2022 order dated 13.02.2024 the Hon'ble Court had formulated this Committee to satisfy about the removal of the deficiencies pointed out by the CBI in the second round of inspection, and that the respondent authorities had adopted a pick and choose policy and invited some colleges before the Committee on 07.01.2025 and 08.01.2025, whereas the Petitioner colleges had been left out and have not been called upon to appear before the Committee.

The fact is that this Committee has been formed by the Hon'ble Court with regard to the Colleges found deficient in the initial (first round of CBI inspections. In addition, the Hon'ble Court in individual cases has directed some Colleges who were found unsuitable in CBI inspections or found deficient in second round of inspections.

The Hon'ble Court in WP No. 38524 of 2024 specifically expressed in para 4 of the Order that *".....instead of directing the Committee, the deficiencies as have been pointed-out by the CBI in second round of inspection, can be considered by the Respondent No. 4"*. Respondent No. 4 in this WP was the MPNRC.

Thus, this Committee has been considering cases of only such Colleges who have been specifically directed by the Hon'ble Court to satisfy this Committee regarding removal of deficiencies.

Notwithstanding the fact that the Petitioner colleges have obtained the orders of the Hon'ble Court by suppression of material facts and deliberate false statements regarding the orders of the Hon'ble Court, the Committee decided to consider the cases instead of referring back the matter to the Hon'ble Court.

Conclusive findings of removal of deficiencies require consideration of all documents, personal hearing and obtaining information during personal hearing to verify the authenticity of averments made in the representation. At times inspection of the college too is warranted to arrive at the facts of removal or continuance of deficiencies. The Committee came across

cases where nursing colleges with their zeal to somehow obtain a 'yes' from the Committee tried to mislead and misrepresented.

With a view to comply with the orders of the Hon'ble Court and keeping in view the deadline given by the Hon'ble Court leaving the Committee with very little time to conduct detailed examinations and affording personal hearings to the colleges, the Committee decided to examine the representations based on prima-facie perusal of the documents submitted along with the representations.

While considering the representations the Committee preferred to err on the side of caution keeping in view a) the intent of the Hon'ble Court in its orders to improve the quality of nursing education and weeding out substandard colleges, and b) the fact that these Colleges have obtained the orders of the Hon'ble Court by giving false statements raising the question on trustworthiness of the statements made in their representations.

The findings of the Committee are as below:

2	Sai School of Nursing, Alirajpur	Unsuitable	The College has not removed the deficiencies of a) having its own building as required under the Rules, b) small size of the built-up area of its rented building, c) small sizes of class rooms and labs, d) deficiencies in labs, e) non-availability of rooms for HODs, Principal, Vice principal and teaching faculty and f) non-availability of Vice principal.
3	Sapphire Institute of Nursing Sciences, Indore	Suitable	Documents submitted by the College support removal of deficiencies noted by CBI team.
4	Sai College of Nursing, Khandwa	Unsuitable	The College does not have its own building as required under rules and its representation does not clarify as to what deficiency it has removed and what it has failed to remove. The representation is without any name and seal of the College or name of the signatory.
5	Swami Vivekanand College of Nursing, Shahdol	Unsuitable	The College has not removed the deficiencies of a) small built-up area, b) small sizes of class rooms, c) deficiencies

			availability of AV aid lab and e) small size of multipurpose hall, etc.
6	Swami Vivekanand College of Nursing, Sagar	Unsuitable	The College has not removed the deficiencies of a) small size of class rooms, b) Rooms for Principal and HODs, c) hostel d) small area of library and library and f) inadequacy of eligible faculty.
7	LCH Nursing Academy, Indore	Unsuitable	The College has not removed the deficiencies of a) small built-up area, b) small size of lab, and multi-purpose hall, c) hostel, e) library, and unsuitability of the building for nursing education – the college runs in a hotel building.
8	Raishree Institute of Nursing, Niwari	Suitable	Documents submitted by the College support removal of deficiencies noted by CBI team for running GNM program.
9	Mithlesh School of Nursing, Tikamgarh	Suitable	Documents submitted by the College support removal of deficiencies noted by CBI team for running GNM program.
10	Parijat College, Indore	Suitable	Documents submitted by the College support removal of deficiencies noted by CBI team for all programs except for MSc.
11	Maha Mrityunjay School of Nursing, Barwani	Unsuitable	Representation and documents provided by the College do not support that it has removed the deficiencies of small area of class rooms, laboratories, common room, principal room, library ,etc.
12	Veerangna Awanti Bai Nursing college, Chhatarpur	Unsuitable	The College has not removed the deficiencies of inadequate area of class rooms and laboratories and b) inadequacies of eligible faculty.
13	Global Prashanti Nursing College, Ujjain	Unsuitable	The College has not provided specific information relating to various deficiencies. From the documents provided by the college it cannot be concluded that the College has removed the deficiencies of a) inadequacy of beds in eligible and functional hospital for practical training, b) inadequate sizes of faculty room, multipurpose hall and preclinical labs and c) inadequacies of OBG and paediatric training of students.
14	Arogya Institute of Nursing, Ratlam	Unsuitable	The College has not removed the deficiencies of a) availability of suitable common rooms, faculty room, multipurpose hall, preclinical lab and room for vice-principal, b) inadequacies relating

			to availability of eligible and qualified faculty and c) inadequacies of library.
15	Maa Vijayalaxmi college of Nursing, Khandwa	Unsuitable	The College has not removed the deficiency of the availability of a building suitable for nursing education. The College runs in a rented commercial complex, which does not have sufficient area and facilities for nursing education.

The Committee also considered representations received from other such colleges who were directed by the Hon'ble High Court in different Writ Petitions to satisfy this Committee regarding removal of deficiencies. For paucity of time and the deadline for recognition for the session 2024-25 being fixed by the Hon'ble Court as 15th January 2025, it was not possible to afford personal hearing to them. Recommendations with regard to these colleges too are being made based on perusal of their representations with accompanying documents/photos.

1	Maa Gyanveer college of Nursing, Sagar	Unsuitable	CBI team had noted that a) the 100 bedded parent hospital had only 52 bed and b) the labs and library did not have adequate articles/equipments/books/journals. From the representation of the College availability of an eligible functional hospital cannot be concluded.
2	Shubhdeep college of Nursing, Khargone	Unsuitable	Removal of deficiency relating to regular availability of eligible and qualified faculty, vice principal and principal cannot be concluded from the representation.
3	BM School of Nursing, Vidisha	Unsuitable	Removal of deficiency relating to availability of an exclusive and suitable building of adequate size for nursing education and regular availability of eligible and qualified faculty cannot be concluded from the representation.

The Hon'ble High Court has passed few more orders on different Writ Petitions on 10th January 2025. Though no representation is now pending with the Committee it is possible that some colleges might have submitted representations in the office of MPNRC. Today being a public holiday, the Nodal Officer of the Committee would come to know if there is any representation received or pending in the office of the Registrar, MPNRC tomorrow morning when offices reopen. To consider any such representation the Committee will meet again tomorrow at 11:00 AM virtually.

The Committee in its last physical meeting decided to visit the SSG Medical Institution, Ujjain to verify its claim that building related deficiencies noted by the CBI team are at variance from the factual position. In view of paucity of time with the Committee members and their being located at distant places, the Committee authorised its Nodal Officer Dr. CP

**MINUTES OF THE MEETING OF THE COMMITTEE APPOINTED BY THE HON'BLE HIGH COURT
TO DETERMINE SUITABILITY OF NURSING COLLEGES IN M.P.
HELD VITUALLY ON 15th JANUARY 2025**

The meeting of the Committee was held virtually wherein the Chairman and Members joined online and Nodal Officer Dr. CP Shukla presented cases of the Colleges.

1. SSG Medical Institution, Ujjain

The Committee had considered the case of the College in its meeting dated 7th January 2025.

In its inspection of the College by CBI team on 07.08.2024, it noted deficiencies of a) College running in two separate buildings 100 meters apart having total area of 14,871 square feet which is less than the required minimum area b) small sizes of all class rooms, pre-clinical science lab, nursing foundation lab, computer lab, AV aids lab and library, c) vacancy of 2 associate professors and one Vice Principal, d) inadequate articles and equipments in labs and e) students not being sent for training at PHC//CHC.

Dr. Sushil Gupta, Chairman of the SSG Education and its Society running the College represented that the deficiencies noted by CBI team in its inspection relating to building are at variance from the facts. In its representation and submissions made before the Committee, the College stated the following:

- a) The two buildings of the College are not 100 meters apart. The two buildings are located on two sides of the parent hospital at a distance of 24 and 10 meters respectively. CBI team has taken the distance from the farthest portion of the building.
- b) The area calculated by CBI team is erroneous. The total built up area is 25,180 square feet as against 14871 square feet noted by CBI team.
- c) By alterations and removal of walls in the building sizes of class rooms and laboratories have been increased to meet the norms.
- d) Vacant posts have been filled by recruitment. Present faculty strength is 37 comprising of a principal, a vice principal, 2 associate professors, 5 assistant professors and 28 tutors.
- e) Additional articles have been procured to remove the deficiencies of labs.

Since the College has questioned the measurement of the built up area, the committee decided for site inspection for arriving at any conclusion regarding removal of building related deficiencies.

In view of paucity of time and location of Committee Chairman and Members at different locations, on 14th January, 2025, the Committee directed its Nodal Officer Dr. CP Shukla to do the site visit and report.

Dr. Shukla visited the college on 14th January 2025 itself and submitted his report today. According to Dr. Shukla he found that the nursing College runs in two blocks (buildings) located on either side of the parent hospital. The distance from hospital to these buildings is not more than 10 meters. The total built-up area is more than 25,000 square feet. The rooms sizes for

class rooms and laboratories, etc are as per requirement under the extant recognition rules. He observed nearly full bed occupancy of the 120 bedded parent hospital.

From the documents and photos submitted by the College the Committee is satisfied that deficiency of articles in labs has been removed. After appointment of additional faculty, the College has sufficient faculty as required under the norms.

Therefore, the Committee finds and recommends that:

1. **For present students:** the College is suitable.
2. **For future students:** Suitable with following limitations:
 - a. keeping in view the limitation of size of class rooms the College can accommodate a batch of maximum of 40 students in BSc and GNM program each.
 - b. Availability of hospital beds from parent hospital and/or any other hospital having a minimum bed strength of 100 beds with regular bed occupancy of more than 60%.

Representations of other Colleges received pursuant to orders dated 10.01.2025 of the Hon'ble Court:

The Committee also considered all the remaining representations received until now pursuant to the directions of the Hon'ble High Court orders dated 10 January 2025.

The Hon'ble High Court in its order dated 10th January in WP No. 877 of 2025 and WP No. 1143 of 2025 directed petitioner nursing Colleges who were found deficient to appear before this Committee and satisfy it with regarding to removal of deficiencies observed by the CBI team in second round of inspections carried out in compliance to the orders of the Hon'ble Court.

Perusal of the orders shows that the Petitioner nursing colleges have obtained order of the Hon'ble Court by misrepresentation and making factually incorrect submissions. 1	Shri Ram Raja College of Nursing. Prithavipur, Dist. Niwari (WP No. -1143 of 2025)	Removal of deficiencies cannot be determined without site inspection.	The deficiencies relate to non-availability of required minimum built-up area, small sizes of all class rooms and labs, etc. and faculty. The College has disputed the observations of built-up area and small sizes of room noted by the CBI team. This requires site inspection and verification at site.
2	Shivani Paramedical Institute, Shahdol. (WP No. 877 of 2025)	Suitable	CBI team noted that the College does not have exclusive building for nursing education, as para medical education is also run in the same building. CBI noted this deficiency on the basis of information obtained from Paramedical Council. Documents and photos submitted by the College show that it presently has two adjacent buildings – one for nursing education and another for para medical education. According to the College, it has an exclusive building of 31,000 square feet and all the required facilities for nursing college. Nodal Officer of the Committee

			Obtained application of the College from the Registrar of Paramedical Council. The application contains geo-tagging information and photos of the building. The location and photos differ from the building of the nursing College. Thus, based on the documents the deficiency of building prima-facie seems to have been remedied.
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The Nodal officer of the Committee, after consideration of the above representations, confirmed that there remains no representation pending with the Committee.
